She won many ribbons for her vegetables, canning, craftwork, flowers, and art. Cindy and her late partner Richard shared this passion for gardening along with music, animals and nature.

Cindy and Richard came to Castlegar, British Columbia in 1988. They lived in Ootischenia for 5 years before buying their dream home in Slocan Park, British Columbia. In 1996 their home was destroyed by a landslide. During the rebuilding process they developed a strong bond with their community which supported their endeavour to build a new dream home. They did build a new home which brought them joy, peace and happiness.

Cindy absolutely loved spending time at the beach across the road from her home. It was where she was happy and at peace.

Cindy is predeceased by her partner Richard Kosior (2016), she is survived by her mother, Donna Stephenson and sister Dara (Dan) Huys of Hythe, Alberta. She is

also survived by many cousins, aunts, uncles, and friends.
